

## Charter School of Educational Excellence, Yonkers, New York

The Charter School of Educational Excellence (CSEE) is a K-8 independent charter school in Yonkers New York. CEI has extensively supported CSEE with on-site professional development and technical assistance guidance.

CSEE is the lead applicant on an Student Support and Academic Enrichment Grant (SSAE) to support Personalized Learning with Effective Use of Technology Grant. SSAE is a federally-funded Title 4 Grant that was award in July of 2018 and will run through October 2019. CEI is the provider of all professional development within this grant, guiding schools in a process of creating a vision for personalized learning within their school, then creating individualized learner profiles and proficiency scales to support this process. CSEE also receives in-depth Professional Development on Social and Emotional Learning as a facet of this grant.

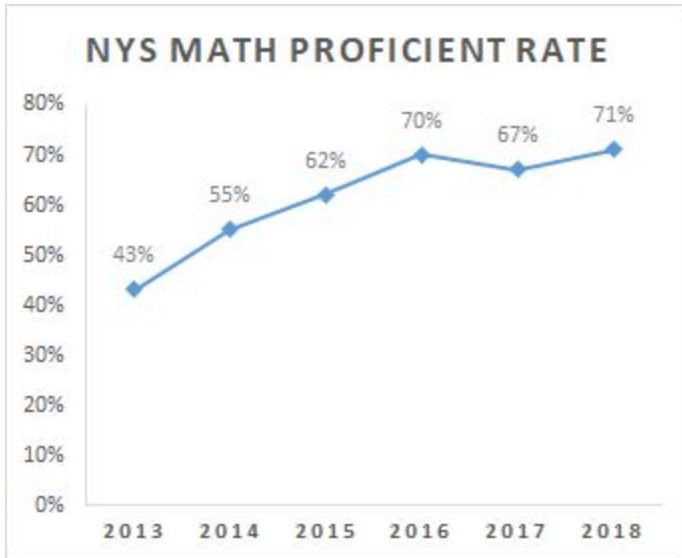
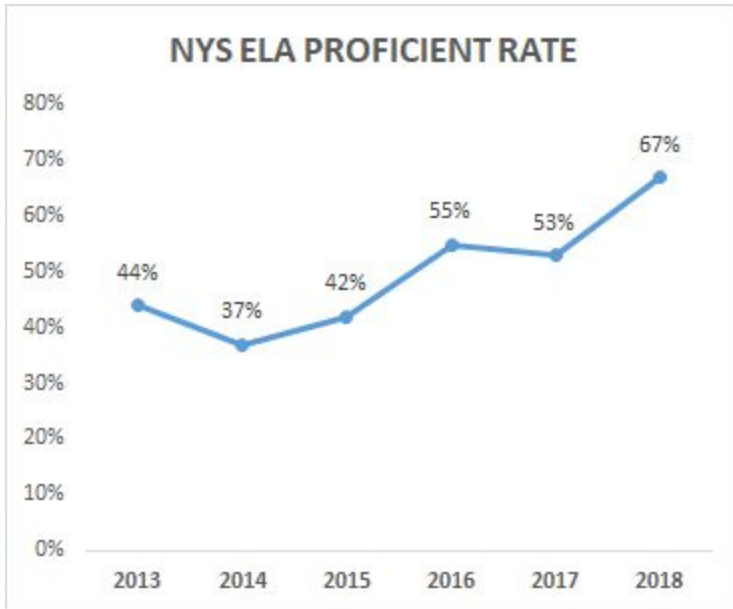
- ***Personalized Learning*** strategies include: understanding the honeycomb model of PL, incorporating voice and choice, building proficiency scales
- ***Social Emotional Learning (SEL)*** strategies include: building competency scales, designing a portrait of a graduate, building units that incorporate SEL scales

Additional professional supports provided by CEI to enhance the academic and professional growth of CSEE include:

- **Danielson Framework for Teaching**: CEI provides on-site professional development on the domains and components of Danielson, conducting workshops on how teachers can make the framework actionable within their classrooms
- **Charter Renewal and Expansion Support**: CEI provides guidance to CSEE in their process of expanding to a high school, providing technical assistance on curriculum and programming
