Overview

With more than four decades of experience, CEI has been creating and redesigning public schools to achieve our vision of a public-school system where every child has access to a high quality, 21st century education. CEI works with all public schools, from district- based schools to charter public schools, to establish rigorous AND supportive learning environments that meet the needs of the students in their communities. Our support begins with an extensive "asset mapping" audit that focuses on strengths to be developed that results in a roadmap for our customized support to meet the specific needs of each school. Our goal is to help you demonstrate your school's uniqueness and strengths, and the paths you have created to optimize learning for all students.

Overview and Description of Services

INSTRUCTIONAL LEADERSHIP AND TEACHER DEVELOPMENT

Overview and Description of Services

CEI Instructional Leadership/Teacher Development service is designed to build educator capacity to accelerate learning and improve student outcomes in collaboration with a school's leaders instructional vision and priorities. CEI consultants collaborate with school leaders to refine and adapt instructional vision and foci. Our goal is to assist you as the school leader in developing a high capacity team with clearly defined strategies for teacher improvement and avenues for leadership advancement (teacher, assistant principal and principal). Overview and Description of Services

CEI specializes in working with individuals and school teams to gain a thorough understanding of the why, what and how of PLCs, as well as build a "tool box" of research, protocols and templates that will enable your school teams to put what they've learned to immediate use. This year-long service encompasses the entire spectrum of what PLCs are (as distinguished from other "teams"), how they use data to shape the work, and why building a school-wide collaborative culture is critical to accelerate student learning. We dive deeply into building better communication and decision-making as PLCs, ensuring stakeholder voice and understanding the dynamics of group development and how to overcome the typical "Five Dysfunctions of a Team." We explore thoroughly Bryk's Improvement Science and PDSA cycles of inquiry (using your school's real time data from classroom practice and assessments) and implement protocols, templates and action plans that sustain the work.

Intended Outcomes

» To enable the successful creation and sustainability of a collaborative PLC culture, focused on dialogue and data analysis, that ensures all children receive instruction, intervention and enrichment matched to their needs.

AI/DIGITAL LITERACY

(Al Integration for Teachers and Students)



Overview and Description of Services

The "Al Integration for Teachers" initiative offers a tailored approach to help teachers effectively incorporate Al into their educational environments. CEI's Al program identifies and prioritizes the unique needs of each school, ensuring that Al solutions address their specific challenges. This platform-agnostic approach avoids the common pitfalls seen in past technology rollouts, such as those during the COVID-19 pandemic, wherein teachers had the directive but not the resources or tools to implement new technologies. CEI's Al program includes creating

workshops, as well as small group coaching that cover essential topics such as:

- » Basics of Generative AI: A foundational overview of how generative AI works and its potential applications.
- » Ethics and Responsibility: A discussion on the ethical use of AI in education, focusing on fairness, transparency, and safeguarding student privacy.
- » Generative AI in Education: Practical examples of how AI can enhance learning, streamline tasks, and improve student engagement in real-world educational settings.

Intended Outcomes

» To enable teachers to gain the knowledge and confidence to use AI tools responsibly and effectively, and tailored to the unique needs of their schools and classrooms.

DEIA/SEL/CRSE WORKSHOPS FOR TEACHERS AND STAFF

Overview and Description of Services

CEI brings its focus on innovation and equity into the DEIA/SEL/CRSE/TRC (Trauma-Informed Classrooms) realm in order to foster courageous conversations with educators about pluralistic identity. Through a series of workshops, CEI's leading experts will support educators through the process of how to:

- » Holistically engage with diverse cultural narratives.
- » Demystify personal bias.
- » Learn inclusive/trauma-responsive language to build and sustain a welcoming school community for all.

SEL professional development workshops are focused on cultivating leadership, enhancing community building, and curating authentic self-awareness skills for educators to further support school wide objectives. The focus of CEI's work is based on NYSED's CRSE Framework and aligned directly with new NYSED guidance that seeks to facilitate the following:

- » Ensure teaching and learning reflect principles of DEIA and provide opportunities for all students to make educational progress.
- » Address punitive student disciplinary policies and practices that result in disproportionality.
- » Ensure effective policies and procedures to prevent and address bullying and harassment.

Each learning objective outlined below is a "building block" for schools to achieve this threefold focus. Further, all of our learning objectives are based in research-based frameworks that reflect DEIA/SEL/CRSE/TRC themes to engage with students and staff in a meaningful, authentic way.

Intended Outcomes

- » To utilize NYSED's CRSE Framework to develop a common understanding and a diversified language of DEIA/SEL/TRC and incorporate it into classroom and school-wide culture.
- » To promote trauma-responsive and culturally responsive competence.
- » To increase self-awareness skills to limit bias practices within our adult interactions and with adult to student interactions to ensure strong connections and collegiality.
- » To increase self-awareness skills to limit bias practices within peer-to-peer, student interactions to ensure strong connections and meaningful engagement, and to eliminate bullying/harassment.
- » To learn how to skillfully intersect DEIA/SEL/TRC components with student college readiness and family planning support.
- » To enhance leadership practice through DEIA/SEL/TRC tools that can positively influence work accountability, student responsibility, fair and equitable disciplinary practices, and time/task management to meet the diverse educational mandates of the school and the community it serves.

Overview

- » To enhance a school's ability to provide emotional support and intervention to address/mitigate trauma.
- » To strengthen the creation of the Language Allocation Policy detailing Native Language and English instruction in ways that exceed mandates and truly promote student learning and language acquisition.

- » To increase participants' knowledge of and ability to implement best practices that will accelerate student learning.
- » To create a "common language" among all educators within a school/district on what constitutes effective pedagogy and assessment.
- » To accelerate student learning!

ARTS EDUCATION FOR STUDENTS AND FAMILIES

Overview

CEI Arts Education is nationally recognized for its innovative, hands-on arts integration programs that use the arts to teach core content and strengthen social emotional learning skills. All CEI Arts Education programs are aligned with NYS Academic and Arts Standards, DLM Essential Elements and NYCPS' Blueprint for Teaching and Learning in the Arts and serve all student populations.



Description of Services

Students: Student arts residencies include arts-integrated programs in visual art, music, dance, theater and spoken word. From creating geometric mobiles and animal-diversity songwriting, to multicultural dances and historical-fiction playwriting, all programs connect the arts with academic content and engage preK-12 students. CEI Arts Education also offers a series of social-action programs that empower young people to have a voice on social issues through the power of art. These engaging programs include: CEI's signature program BENCHMARKS — in which students create murals on benches for display in NYC Parks citywide,

as well as WALLS4CHANGE, SONGS4CHANGE, DRAMA4CHANGE, WORDS4CHANGE, and DANCE4CHANGE. All social-action programs feature Guest Artist visits and a citywide event.

Intended Outcomes

- » To empower student voices on community issues.
- » To increase student awareness and understanding of the arts.
- » To increase student cultural awareness their own and other cultures.
- » To utilize the arts as a means of improving self-expression as well as academic enrichment.



Description of Services

Families: CEI Arts Education also presents parent/family engagement programs that bring parents into the school community and include educational arts projects that parents can replicate with their children. There is a wide range of programming including creating board games, jewelry making, Latin dance, percussion and poetry slams, among many others.

Intended Outcomes

» To provide meaningful engagement with the arts for families in their homes and to bring families into the school community.

PROJECT BOOST

(Building Options And Opportunities For STudents)

Overview

Building Options and Opportunities for Students is CEI's signature enrichment program which helps students gain the skills and talents necessary for long term growth and success. The Project BOOST model provides academic support, social and emotional skills support, cultural enrichment and community engagement. Project BOOST provides character building experiences, nurturing individual aspirations and communicating the possibilities for unlimited success, regardless of background. Academic support includes interactive, hands-on STEAM instruction, coding and robotics, academic goal setting, and college visits. As with all of CEI's services, the overarching goal is to disrupt inequities and reduce barriers to opportunity for all students.







Description of Services

The program includes customized museum learning experiences aligned with curriculum through partnerships with institutions such as the Bronx Zoo and the New York Hall of Science. Project BOOST provides social emotional support and teaches social skills, including age-appropriate activities focused on personal goal setting, team building, character education, and employment skills. BOOST is designed to serve the school and community's needs and can occur before, during or after the school day, and on nights and weekends. The experiences that students gain in these programs are often life-altering for them.

Intended Outcomes

Among the aspects of the programs that students highlight as keenly important to them are:

- » The unique experiences that they feel are otherwise beyond their reach.
- » The value of gaining one-on-one mentoring and guidance.
- » A sense of increased self-esteem.
- » Gaining positive values and understanding the importance of personal academic commitment and achievement, especially in developing one's own college/career pathway.

PROJECT BOOST: EARLY STAGES

Overview

CEI's Early Stages Program is perhaps the most well-known and longest tradition within CEI for providing traditional public schools and public charter schools students with the life-changing experience of attending live performances of theater, dance and music. Students, often with family members, are introduced to a new part of NYC, experience renowned performing arts venues, such as Broadway theaters, Lincoln Center and Carnegie Hall, and have the opportunities to reflect about their own lives through discussions and writing about the performance experience.





Description of Services

Students attend regularly scheduled performances so they experience live theater in a "real-world" situation and gain confidence to return on their own. Every group of students is greeted when they arrive at the theater to answer questions and ensure that they will feel comfortable. We provide an orientation for our primary contact person at each participating school. We also provide basic information on theatergoing, as well as specific background on performances, and work with teachers so that the theater experience can be integrated into the classroom. Students are required to write their response to the performance and teachers complete an online questionnaire about the experience. Through the writing and guidance material, we support discussions and other post-performance activities that enhance the meaningfulness of the experience.

Intended Outcomes

- » To ensure that public school students of all social and economic backgrounds find a sense of belonging at the theater.
- » To provide support to school staff so that they are comfortable and informed chaperones and can integrate the theater experience into their classrooms.
- » To validate students' responses to the theater experience so that it continues to be meaningful and memorable, thereby growing the next generation of theatergoers!

PROJECT BOOST: HIGH IMPACT TUTORING/ PROJECT RESET

Overview and Description of Services

CEI's academic enrichment and intervention services provide much needed small group and individual coaching and social emotional support for students while reinforcing and expanding the work of classroom teachers. Whether designed as synchronous, remote learning or "elbowto-elbow," in person instruction, the goal is to reinforce and enhance students' learning strengths while also addressing gaps in their learning. Our instructional coaches are experienced with deep knowledge in all content areas and SHSAT, SAT/ACT and AP test prep. CEI has partnered with the Reset Group for their Project Reset Regents Prep program that provides extensive tutoring for Middle School students on the Algebra 1 and Living Environments Regents exams. This is a yearlong program that includes after school and Saturday sessions. Districts 5, 13, 17, 23 and 29 schools are currently sought for pilots.

Intended Outcomes

- » Through participation in our high impact tutoring services, students will demonstrate greater competency and confidence in their subject matter.
- » Students participating in our high impact tutoring services will improve their student outcomes as measured by standardized assessments of learning (including Algebra 1 and Living Environment Regents for 8th grade students).
- » Students participating in our high impact tutoring services will significantly improve their chances of enrolling in one of the NYCPS' premier high schools.

PROJECT BOOST: POSSIBILITY DEVELOPMENT (COLLEGE & CAREER READINESS APP)

Overview and Description of Services

Drawing from the fields of person-centered and cognitive-behavioral counseling, and the developmental strategy of scaffolding for skill development, Dr. Mike Nakkula's "Possibility Development" has five discrete steps:

- (1) Exploring personal interests;
- (2) Prioritizing interests to pursue, based on a values assessment of what matters most;
- (3) Planning for action, including establishing realistic short and long term goals;
- (4) Putting the plan into action, starting with the attainment of short-term goals, while learning how this process relates to longer-term goals; and
- (5) Assessing progress toward goal achievement and potentially changing course if needed.

Through our program, students learn to achieve what they care about most by learning and applying the steps of Possibility Development to the common goal of College and Career readiness. Our app-based program gives students agency over their educational journey as they visualize and then create a plan to achieve their post-secondary school goals. CEI supports every student in your school/district by presenting the program through an in-person, interactive presentation to onboard and motivate your students. Through ongoing support, weekly homework activities, and parent engagement tools students are guided each step of the way as they create a plan for their future success.

- » To teach students how to achieve what they care about most.
- » To enable students to create a plan around their college and career goals.

PROJECT BOOST: DIGITAL TECHNOLOGIES EXPLORATION

AI/VR (Virtual Reality) Discovery



Overview and Description of Services

CEI's AI course designed for 8th graders integrates Artificial Intelligence (AI) tools to enhance learning across multiple subjects, while also introducing students to coding and exploring STEM career pathways. The curriculum is designed to build digital literacy, critical thinking, and problem-solving skills, while helping students understand how AI differs from traditional programming methods. Each week, students will also engage in discussions about various STEM careers, with a new pathway highlighted weekly, expanding their awareness of potential future

opportunities. The course begins with an introduction to digital tools such as Google Classroom, Google Drive, and ChatGPT. Students will learn how to navigate these platforms to support their academic work and enhance communication between school and home. One of the core foci of the course is the integration of coding education. Students will be introduced to basic coding concepts, learning to write and debug simple programs. The course will then delve into how AI functions differently from traditional coding, emphasizing how AI uses data and algorithms to generate responses, rather than relying on predefined instructions. This comparison helps students grasp the flexibility of AI versus the structured nature of traditional programming.

Another unit focuses on creative problem-solving with AI, where students use ChatGPT to generate innovative solutions for real-world challenges. They will develop a proposal for an innovation center at their school, using AI to iterate designs and refine ideas. The goal is to demonstrate how AI can support the design process by generating and modifying solutions based on specific criteria and goals. They will use AI to brainstorm, draft and organize their ideas as well as generate visual summaries, timelines, diagrams and infographics. This has an easier crossover to creating visual representations to support their written work, helping to clarify and synthesize complex topics in subjects like science and history.

The course also emphasizes the role of AI in bridging communication gaps between schools and communities. Students will create AI-assisted newsletters, translate materials for non-English-speaking families, and propose ways to increase community engagement using AI. This unit highlights how AI tools can simplify complex information and make school resources more accessible.

Intended Outcomes

- » To enhance students' cognitive processes such as summarizing, comparing, analyzing and organizing information for presentation on real world applications.
- » To provide a comprehensive introduction to AI, coding, and STEM career pathways.
- » To equip students with essential skills for academic success and future job readiness, by preparing them to navigate both traditional and emerging tech fields.

PROJECT BOOST: DIGITAL TECHNOLOGIES EXPLORATION

Coding

Overview and Description of Services

CEI's coding program is designed to break down students' common misconception that tech isn't for them. Through CEI's Code Your Own Video Game Program, all students learn how to code and create their video games. Students are led through the basic programming concepts, using a block coding infrastructure, as they work through all the fundamentals of coding. Students learn that not only are video games fun, but they are also multidisciplinary. The games students build incorporate math, physics and art in meaningful and enjoyable ways. What is especially exciting for the students is that by the end of the course, they have built their own game they can play and share with friends and family. And, they've gained the confidence that they can succeed in STEM!

Intended Outcomes

Our coding program will provide students with:

- » A basic understanding of the fundamentals of coding.
- » The experience of building their own shareable video game from scratch!
- » Confidence that they can succeed at coding and STEM.

Robotics (including 1st Lego League)

Overview and Description of Services

The CEI Robotics Program is designed to empower students by demonstrating that robotics and coding are accessible to everyone, helping to break the misconception that STEM is only for a select few. The primary goal is to foster a lifelong love for STEM by immersing students in engaging, hands-on learning experiences. The program is suitable for grades 3-12, and typically runs over 8-16 sessions, each lasting 90 minutes., but is very flexible. culminates in student group building and coding a boxing robot and competing in a boxing competition with their peers. Program highlights include:


- » STEM Immersion: Students build, test, and troubleshoot their robots, developing a deep understanding of STEM concepts as they progress through the program.
- » Multidisciplinary Skills:
 - » Engineering: Students learn to identify robot parts and their functions while exploring real-world applications.
 - » Coding: Through block-style software, students enhance their critical and sequential thinking by learning to code their robots.
 - » Design: Using the Design Process framework, students connect system design with practical needs, fostering creativity and problem-solving skills.
 - » Collaboration & Communication: Students work in teams to tackle design challenges, developing collaboration and communication skills.
- » Teacher Professional Development: CEI offers training for teachers, equipping them to teach robotics and coding while building a comprehensive curriculum.
- » 1st Lego League: CEI coaches can facilitate a 1st Lego League team at your school!

Intended Outcomes

» The CEI Robotics Program is designed to inspire, engage, and equip students with valuable skills for the future, making STEM accessible and exciting for all.

PROJECT BOOST: DIGITAL TECHNOLOGIES EXPLORATION

FACT (Families And Children Together) Coding Academy



Overview and Description of Services

In this 6-week course, students along with their caregivers will work together to build their own video games and learn to code. **No previous experience is needed!** The program begins with teams creating an account on Scratch (scratch.mit.edu) and then choosing a theme for their video game (including, but not limited to, their hero, background, and enemies). Students in teams with their caregivers are then instructed on how to build their games as they learn the basics of coding. Together, teams will get their characters to move, jump, interact with other

characters, collect points, gain power, and fight end bosses. Recommended age for students (Grades 3-8) for adults 18-108. The course is virtual and requires a laptop or an iPad and an internet connection and takes place 10am-noon on 6 consecutive Saturdays. Each class will build on the previous one so attendance at all sessions is highly recommended.

Intended Outcomes

- » Students and their caregivers will also be introduced to the basics of animations as they create characters that come to life; by learning and using digital design and art.
- » Physics and math will also be incorporated as their heroes navigate a 2D world, jump, and throw objects.
- » Students and their caregivers will be presented with different jobs and careers that can be possible by learning how to code.

Drones Programs

Overview and Description of Services

CEI is pleased to partner with several organizations (such as "Drone Cadets") that offer drone development and drone piloting to schools. Drone programs, whether in person or online, allow students to explore the basics of aerodynamics and drone design, testing and flight. Students will understand that there is an art and a science to creating just the right design for just the right conditions to pilot and reach optimum speed. Students also learn to code, using Betaflight Configurator, an open-source platform that can continually adjust to match the skill of the pilot. Flight missions and hands-on activities enhance the learning experience. Through Virtual Reality, we can also replicate a wide range of real world situations that a pilot would encounter to further develop piloting skills.

- » To communicate a high comfort level with basic drone flight, including "soft skills" such as hand-eye coordination, communication and listening, self-confidence, critical thinking and troubleshooting.
- » To use safety and flight procedures including the role of the team, navigational directional terminology, and a Pre-Flight Checklist
- » To understand and implement the basic FAA rules for drone piloting.

PROJECT BOOST: ESPORTS

Overview

CEI ESPORTS is an innovative program designed to bridge the gap between traditional education and the burgeoning field of Esports. CEI Esports strives to give students not only essential knowledge of the history of various sectors of Esports but also create a classroom culture that reinforces the social-emotional skills the students are not practicing while gaming at home with their friends. More specifically, CEI Esports works with the students to strengthen their interpersonal communication, teamwork, leadership, and problem-solving skills needed to succeed not only in Esports but also in their everyday life.







Description of Services

CEI Esports presents a unique and extensive curriculum created solely by our CEI Esports team and focused not only on gaming skills and concepts but on character building (determination, perseverance, anger/stress management, etc.), conflict resolution, communication, goal setting and decision-making, and leadership. CEI Esports provides these lessons within the context of our after-school competitive esports programs. In addition, CEI has the staff and experience to provide schools with their own customized Esports Team and accompanying Esports Lab/Arena. Finally, the CEI Esports program continuously works towards building not just better students. but better people who will have the character and knowledge to succeed in college and/or any other ventures they may have after high school.

- » To provide schools with the appropriate equipment and training to be able to play and compete in some of the most popular titles, casually and competitively.
- » To expose students to competitive Esports in various titles, including NBA 2K, Super Smash Bros, and FIFA, with the opportunity to formalize school teams.
- » To provide a one-of-a-kind Esports program that includes lessons on topics such as the History of Esports, Gamer Health, Evolution of Consoles, Digital Citizenship, Branding and Streaming (just to name a few!)
- » To work with students on social-emotional learning topics such as: building stamina and confidence, leadership, effective communication and sportsmanship.

PROJECT BOOST: LITERARY DEVELOPMENT

Read to Lead

Overview

CEI's Read to Lead is a platform offering a supplemental literacy curriculum with career exploration, academic and social emotional skill development in the form of unique literacy learning games set in diverse professional worlds. These digital learning games, personalized pathways and the supporting curriculum empower middle school students by putting them in the role of the boss, where they must read closely, tackle authentic workplace challenges and make evidence-based decisions. Through our immersive virtual workplace experiences, students improve reading and writing skills, acquire and apply essential 21st century skills and imagine new possibilities for themselves to achieve new-found ambitions. Description of Services

- » Reimagining the student experience through Career Pathways (career-connected learning and pathways) highlighting a series of career exploration experiences.
- » Building strong plans for every student to achieve college/career readiness, especially through leadership development as they complete tasks that replicate work leadership and authentic decision-making.
- » Prioritizing wellness and its link to student success by increasing a school's capacity to provide quality wellness practices (SEL, trauma-informed, mindfulness, self-expression/advocacy) that are scientifically researched and culturally responsive.

Intended Outcomes

- » To explore 5 career pathways (Journalism, Public Service, Medicine, Pharmacy, Asset Management) with students, with exposure to 25+ additional careers.
- » To foster student agency as they become the "boss" in an immersive day at work.
- » To build students' literacy by focusing on background knowledge and vocabulary (particularly, "world of work" concepts and terms) and on improving comprehension.
- » To gather and analyze real-time student data and insights.

Storyworld

Overview and Description of Services

CEI has partnered with STORYWORLD, an online platform for enhancing literacy development, particularly among early and/or emergent readers. StoryWorld's use of translanguaging techniques which honors native languages while scaffolding English literacy skills, is unique. The increase in native languages in NYC schools beyond Spanish calls for appropriately translated content in multiple languages. StoryWorld honors 12 different languages (with opportunities to add more as needed) and allows students to fluidly move from their native language to English (or vice versa) to build confidence and understanding, as well as literacy growth. StoryWorld's multimodal activities allow ELL's to gradually build their reading, listening, speaking and writing skills. StoryWorld weaves together language comprehension and phonics —focusing on the mastery of one story a week. Each story is paired with phonics lessons to build a strong foundation in literacy (96 lessons.) [https://storyworld.us]

- » To provide an online enrichment/intervention program that significantly improves student literacy skills and development within an engaging, multi-lingual experience
- » To provide educators with real time data on student progress in literacy development

PROJECT BOOST: RISE (COLLEGE STUDENTS AS MIDDLE SCHOOL MENTORS)

RISE: Response-ability+Integrity+Self-Advocacy+Excellence

Overview

The RISE program is designed to match two college students (one male, one female) for 8–12 hours/week at a middle school to serve as "mentors" to MS students in order to develop student-centered initiatives such as:

- » Student Council or Student Government Organization (SGO)
- » Peer Mediation/Conflict Resolution
- » Restorative Circles
- » Community Service/Community Engagement Projects

Description of Services

The College Mentors are vetted (interview, references, background check/fingerprint clearance) prior to working in the schools. They must make a commitment to the full year, or 30 weeks (15 per semester). They must be in the school for 8-12 hours/week (actual hours determined by the school). Training will be provided prior to the start of their mentoring in the schools, and at mandatory trainings through the year, covering topics such as: Adolescent Development; Communication Skills and Active Listening; Goal Setting, Action Planning and Work Project Management; Time Management; De-escalation Strategies and Mindfulness Practices; Personal Boundaries, Confidentiality, and Self-Disclosure; The CASEL framework for Social-Emotional Learning (SEL); Peer Mediation/Conflict Resolution; Restorative Circles; and Robert's Rules of Order. School leaders will determine the area(s) of focus for the College Mentors within a given school. Schools will be asked to select a member of the staff to serve as their facilitator/advisor (main point of contact). This staff member will: meet initially with the College Mentors to develop priorities and goals (approved by the Principal); develop a process for dealing with urgent situations (approved by the Principal); meet bi-weekly for a check-in with the College Mentors for at least 30 minutes; and sign off monthly on timesheets and activity logs. The College Mentors will be supervised by staff from CEI and will be visited at least twice per month at the school site. These CEI staff members will be available at all times to the designated Advisor or the Principal to discuss the Mentors, the program or any other issue or concern.

Intended Outcomes

- » To provide a unique opportunity for college students and middle school students to interact, and to collaborate on and implement programs that are authentic to their lives and their communities.
- » To free up time and staff within the school for academics and other pursuits by having the college student mentors assume responsibility for student advocacy programs, events and functions.
- » To create a collaborative network of student leaders within and across districts to exchange ideas, present projects and grow from interacting with one another.
